Geology/Geography

Mount Ogden, which hovers over the city of Ogden, Utah in the USA, is 2917 meters (9570 feet) above sea-level. This makes it the 402<sup>nd</sup> highest peak in the State of Utah. The highest peak in that State being Kings Peak at 4,124 meters (13,528 feet) high. Mount Ogden is in the Wassatch Mountain Range which is a range of the Rocky Mountains in the western United States. Mount Ogden, as well as the City of Ogden, were named after Peter Skene Ogden, born in 1794, who was an experienced trapper and mountain man who explored and trapped the area in 1825 with a brigade of men from the Hudson's Bay Company.
